



End of year successes 2022 to 2023

KS2 (Y6 children)

Reading

88% of Y6 children achieved the expected standard or higher (15% above national). In addition, a staggering **42% of the children achieved the highest standard (this is 13% above national)**

Writing

91% of Y6 children achieved the expected standard or higher (20% above national). In addition, **19% of the children achieved the highest standard (this is 6% above national)**

GPS

90% of Y6 children achieved the expected standard or higher (18% above national). In addition, a staggering **46% of the children achieved the highest standard (this is 16% above national)**.

Maths

93% of Y6 children achieved the expected standard or higher (20% above national) In addition, a staggering **37% of the children achieved the highest standard (this is 13% above national)**.

Combined reading, writing & maths

88% of Y6 children achieved the expected standard or higher (28% above national) In addition, **16% of the children achieved the highest standard (this is 8% above national)**.

63% achieved 25/25 and 73% got at least 23/25.

KS1 (Y2 children)

Reading

83% of Y2 children achieved the expected standard or higher (15% above national). In addition, 30% of the children achieved the highest standard (this is 11% above national).

Writing

80% of Y2 children achieved the expected standard or higher (20% above national), with 7% of the children achieving the highest standard.

Maths

77% of Y2 children achieved the expected standard (7% above national), with 27% of the children achieving the highest standard (11% above national).

Combined reading, writing & maths

73% of Y2 children achieved the expected standard or higher (17% above national), with 7% of the children achieving the highest standard.

Phonics (Y1 children)

87% achieved the expected standard (8% higher than national) and 4% higher than last year.

EYFS (Reception children)

72% achieved a good level of development (GLD). This was 5% above national and **the first time Booth Wood has been above national in GLD.**
